I'm Steve's partner in this venture, (i.e.) refinishing with moly coatings. I've been involved professionally in the business for 6 years now and I have found

that not only is your product the easiest to apply and the most durable, but that matching colors is so much better than the hit and miss process that I've had to use in the past. You know yourself that aluminum is one of the worst metals to get a match on when touching up or refinishing completely. This moly coat is the answer to many of a gunsmith's prayers. No fuss, no muss, just spray, bake and forget. It's wonderful! I recently started the refinish of my personal bastardized AR-15 that I had built prior to getting my FFL in 1993, it's a true parts gun and none of the parts matched in color since it's conception.

Not so now, this son of a gun looks very uniform and that flat black looks as cold as ice. I personally prefer the flat black, but the dark gray is very nice also. Next up, the old Beretta 92 followed by my Weatherby Mark V Fibermark in 300 Wby Mag. The Bee has a McMillan stock and I'm going to spray it as well, I'm tired of things not matching, and your product has made that a thing of the past.

Did you ever consider concocting a clear matte finish so that the outer coat of moly would have even more durability? This would be the cat's ass as far as I'm concerned. Finish the gun then shoot a couple of clear non reflective coats over top to add even more durability. Give it some thought would you?
